On March 23<sup>rd</sup> 2017, the South Sioux City Chapter of the National Honor Society will induct new members in the annual ceremony.

To be eligible for membership, a student must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.3 or above as of January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2017. In addition to the academic requirement, participation and leadership in school and community activities is required. The faculty will be reviewing all tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grade students who are academically eligible for membership. The final selection is determined by a Faculty Council. **Membership in the National Honor Society is based upon excellence in four areas: scholarship, leadership, service, and character. Each category is judged separately.**
